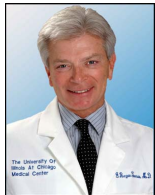

Keynote Speaker: William Dale, M.D. Our keynote speaker at this year's meeting will be geriatrician and health policy expert, Dr. William Dale. Dr. Dale is an Associate Professor of Medicine and Chief of the Section of Geriatrics and Palliative Medicine in the Department of Medicine at the University of Chicago. He is also the founding Director of the Specialized Oncology Care & Research in the Elderly (SOCARE) clinic. His research focuses on medical decision-making, quality of life, and frailty in older adults. He has tackled one of the more challenging areas in oncology, specifically decision-making in the treatment of older adults with cancer, with a focus on prostate cancer. He studies the impact of anxiety on screening, diagnosis, and treatment decisions for older adults.

His lecture will address surgical decision-making in older adults, with a focus on the impact of emotions on high-stakes surgical decisions. Utilizing his work in surveillance decision-making for older adults with prostate cancer, pancreas cancer, and abdominal aortic aneurysms as models, he will discuss the challenges of decision-making for older patients with head and neck disorders. We look forward to his comments and anticipate he will provide much-needed assistance to otolaryngologists who provide care for the rapidly growing number of older adults in our country.



Guest of Honor: J. Regan Thomas, M.D. Dr. Thomas, a double board-certified facial plastic surgeon, is one of the most innovative, peer-acclaimed experts in the field. Dr. Thomas completed an Otolaryngology residency at the University of Missouri School of Medicine, a surgical residency at Yale University, and a fellowship in Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery at Northwestern University. He teaches Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery to UIC medical students, residents, and fellowship physicians. With more than 25 years expertise, he is involved in the development of the latest techniques and procedures in facial plastic and reconstructive surgery. Acclaimed for his practice, research, and leadership, he frequently publishes in the most prestigious medical journals and textbooks. He has authored more than 200 scientific papers and publications, including three textbooks. Heralded by colleagues, Dr. Thomas has previously served as president of the American Academy of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery and is the current president of the American Academy of Otolaryngology -- Head and Neck Surgery. Dr. Thomas' specialties include rhinoplasty, blepharoplasty, facelift (rhytidectomy), and multiple other cosmetic and reconstructive surgical procedures of the face, head and neck. Dr. Thomas' expertise also includes the treatment of wrinkles and the aging face with a variety of injectable solutions.
