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Keynote Speaker: KJ Lee, M.D. Our keynote speaker at this year's meeting will be otolaryngologist and health policy expert, Dr. KJ Lee. Dr Lee is a past president of the American Academy of Otolaryngology and is well known to all otolaryngologists. He has authored a number of texts, the most renown of which is the board review text *Essential Otolaryngology*, now in its 10th edition. Dr Lee has been an active leader in organized medicine, and has served as an advisor to a number of political leaders regarding issues of healthcare delivery in the United States.

His address will comment on the management of older adults in the coming era of diminishing resources. Doctor Lee will tailor his presentation to the political scene that is apparent as of April 2012. With the failure of the "Super Committee" to achieve its goals and the ongoing controversy over strategies for the "Medicare Fix," it is impossible to predict at this time what direction his talk will take. Nonetheless, it seems inevitable that all physicians who treat older

adults will be required to adapt their practices to “do more with less” in order to continue to provide high quality and compassionate care to the senior citizens of our nation.



Guest of Honor: Sarah H. Kagan, Ph.D., RN is the Lucy Walker Honorary Term Professor of Gerontological Nursing and Clinical Nurse Specialist in the Abramson Cancer Center at the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. Kagan holds degrees from the University of Chicago, Rush, and UCSF. Dr. Kagan has focused her career on cross-disciplinary clinical scholarship aimed at understanding the needs and experiences of older adults with cancer. Her work is acknowledged nationally and internationally as innovative, sophisticated and clinically relevant. Dr. Kagan has held visiting professorships at notable institutions nationally and internationally and is a recipient of the both the Sigma Theta Tau International Founders Award for Excellence in Nursing Practice and the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Fellowship. Her talk will focus on the role of collaboration and teamwork in the future of geriatric otolaryngology
